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## ALEXANDER ANNOUNCES THAT MEDICARE RX ENROLLMENT BEGINS TODAY

### PROGRAM TO HELP SENIORS SAVE MONEY ON PRESCRIPTION DRUGS

Washington, D.C. --U.S. Rep. Rodney Alexander, R-Quitman, announced today that 5th District seniors can begin signing up for the new Medicare Prescription Drug Benefit plan.

**"I voted for this plan during my first congressional term,"** Alexander said. **"The reason is because my district has an aging population in need of cheaper prescription drugs. I believe that this plan, though somewhat complicated, will help seniors save more on their prescription drugs."**

Alexander asks that all seniors interested in the new drug plan follow the "Four Ws."

### *The Four Ws of the New Medicare Prescription Drug Benefit*

#### WHO should sign up?

- Everyone enrolled in Medicare can join a drug plan to get this coverage.
- Even if a senior doesn't use a lot of prescription drugs now, he/she should still consider joining a Medicare drug plan. As we age, most people need prescription drugs to stay healthy and the drug benefit provides insurance against future high drug costs.

#### WHAT benefits can I expect from signing up?

- For the first time since it was established in 1965, Medicare will offer outpatient prescription drug coverage to America's seniors.
- **It's voluntary.** Seniors already enjoying employer-sponsored benefits can keep that coverage.
- Consumers can choose from at least 10 national plans and additional regional or state plans, depending on where they live, that cover brand name and generic drugs.
- Introducing competition to the Medicare program is driving down prices; there are some plans that have zero premiums, some that have zero deductibles, etc.

- CMS estimates that the prescription drug benefit, on average, will cover about half of a person's drug costs next year.
- Those with low incomes will save even more. About one-third of all people with Medicare will qualify for extra help that will cover between 85 percent and almost 100 percent of prescription drug costs. You may qualify for additional assistance if your resources are less than \$11,500 if you are single or \$23,000 if you are married and living with your spouse.
- If needed, seniors can revisit their options and change their Medicare plan every year.

#### WHERE do I get information about signing up?

#### WHEN

- Seniors can begin signing up for the drug benefit on **November 15, 2005**.
- The benefits will be available beginning January 1, 2006.
- Sign up for a stand-alone prescription drug plan by May 15, 2006 to avoid incurring a penalty.
