NOTE:

The Appropriations Committee's scoring of the President's Budget differs significantly from CBO's scoring of the President's Budget. In particular, CBO scores the President's Budget at \$746,951 million. Major differences include the scoring of the Agriculture, Defense, L/HHS/ED, Military Construction, Transportation, and VA/HUD bills.

The House-passed Budget Resolution, which was based on CBO numbers, was \$1,145 million above the President's request to reflect the fact that the House did not adopt the President's proposed co-pay for Veterans Medical Care.
