Q: What committees does Congressman Cleaver sit on?

A: Congressman Cleaver is a member of the House Committee on Financial Services and serves on the following subcommittees:
Investigation and Oversight Subcommittee
Housing and Community Opportunity Subcommittee
Financial Institutions &
Consumer Credit Subcommittee

Congressman Cleaver also serves on the Speaker's Select Committee on Energy Independence and Global Warming.

Q: What area of Missouri does Congressman Cleaver represent?

A: Congressman Cleaver represents Missouri's Fifth District, which includes most of Jackson County, Missouri and Raymore, Belton and Peculiar in Cass County. All of Kansas City south of the Missouri River, Independence, Raytown, Lee's Summit, Lone Jack, Grandview, and Sugar Creek are all included in the Fifth District.
