



## Program Consolidation & Elimination In H.R. 1

	# of Programs	Total Spending
Appropriated Last Year	58*	\$18.4 Billion
President's Request	34	Less than \$20 Billion
Authorized in H.R. 1	50*	\$22.9 Billion for 35 Programs+ Such Sums for 15 Other Programs

\*The Committee is moving three programs counted in the 58 funded last year to a separate authorization bill.

- H.R. 1 eliminates or consolidates 27 programs that were funded last year at a total of \$7.5 billion.
- H.R. 1 creates 22 “new” programs with a total authorization of \$8.3 Billion+ (Some of the “new” programs are very similar to programs whose current authorization were eliminated.).
- The Committee plans to reauthorize three current ESEA programs in a separate bill.
- **In total, there are five fewer distinct programs under H.R. 1 as compared to what was funded last year.**
- **At \$23 Billion, the Bill is already a 25% increase in funding.** Source: CRS
