## **RSC Chairman Responds to Administration's Budget: "Spending Is Still Too High"**

WASHINGTON, DC – Rep. Sue Myrick, (R-NC), Chairman of the House Republican Study Committee (RSC), a caucus of more than 90 House conservatives, responded to President Bush's budget proposal for fiscal year 2005.

"Today President Bush presented his Fiscal Year 2005 budget. His budget proposes a number of program deductions and terminations. While he showed restraint in several areas, the total spending is still too high. My RSC colleagues and I will continue to work with the President to reduce spending on existing programs, and eliminate duplicitous, obsolete, and non functioning programs."

"Hard working Americans have to watch their spending, and so should Congress. Congress has got to get in the mindset of spending less. I will continue to remind my colleagues in Congress of Americans who expect us to be responsible with their tax dollars."
