Mr. KUCINICH submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on _____

RESOLUTION

Requesting the President to transmit to the House of Representatives not later 14 days after the date of the adoption of this resolution documents or other materials in the President's possession relating to Iraq's weapons of mass destruction.

- 1 *Resolved*, That the President is requested to transmit
- 2 to the House of Representatives not later 14 days after
- 3 the date of the adoption of this resolution documents or
- 4 other materials in the President's possession that provides



1 specific evidence for the following claims relating to Iraq's
2 weapons of mass destruction:

3 (1) On October 7, 2002, in a speech in Cin-
4 cinnati, Ohio, the President stated: "It [Iraq] pos-
5 sesses and produces chemical and biological weap-
6 ons. It is seeking nuclear weapons. . . And surveil-
7 lance photos reveal that the regime is rebuilding fa-
8 cilities that it had used to produce chemical and bio-
9 logical weapons."

10 (2) On September 12, 2002, in a speech to the
11 United Nations General Assembly, the President
12 stated: "Right now, Iraq is expanding and improving
13 facilities that were used for the production of bio-
14 logical weapons. . . Iraq has made several attempts
15 to buy high-strength aluminum tubes used to enrich
16 uranium for a nuclear weapon."

17 (3) On March 17, 2003, in an Address to the
18 Nation, the President stated: "Intelligence gathered
19 by this and other governments leaves no doubt that
20 the Iraq regime continues to possess and conceal
21 some of the most lethal weapons ever devised."

22 (4) On January 9, 2003, in his daily press
23 briefing, the White House spokesperson stated: "We
24 know for a fact that there are weapons there [in
25 Iraq]."



1 (5) On March 21, 2003, in his daily press brief-
2 ing, the White House spokesperson stated: “Well,
3 there is no question that we have evidence and infor-
4 mation that Iraq has weapons of mass destruction,
5 biological and chemical particularly. . .all this will
6 be made clear in the course of the operation, for
7 whatever duration it takes.”.

8 (6) On August 26, 2002, the Vice President in
9 a speech stated: “Simply stated, there is no doubt
10 that Saddam Hussein now has weapons of mass de-
11 struction... What he wants is time, and more time to
12 husband his resources to invest in his ongoing chem-
13 ical and biological weapons program, and to gain
14 possession of nuclear weapons.”.

15 (7) On March 16, 2003, in an appearance on
16 NBC’s “Meet The Press”, the Vice President stated:
17 “We believe he [Saddam Hussein] has, in fact, re-
18 constituted nuclear weapons. I think Mr. El Baradei
19 frankly is wrong.”.

20 (8) On January 7, 2003, the Secretary of De-
21 fense at a press briefing stated: “There is no doubt
22 in my mind but that they currently have chemical
23 and biological weapons.”.

24 (9) On March 24, 2003, in an appearance on
25 CBS’s “Face the Nation”, the Secretary of Defense



1 stated: “We have seen intelligence over many
2 months that they have chemical and biological weap-
3 ons, and that they have dispersed them and that
4 they’re weaponized and that, in one case at least,
5 the command and control arrangements have been
6 established.”.

7 (10) On March 30, 2003, in an appearance on
8 ABC’s “This Week”, the Secretary of Defense stat-
9 ed: “We know where they [weapons of mass destruc-
10 tion] are, they are in the area around Tikrit and
11 Baghdad.”.
