Lando Volunteer Fire Department Wins Federal Grant

WASHINGTON – U.S. Rep. John Spratt (D-SC) and Lando Fire District Chairman Vernon Terry announced today that Lando Volunteer Fire Department has been awarded a \$91,017 grant from the U.S. Fire Administration. The “Assistant for Firefighters Grant” will be used to buy needed safety equipment for the Edgemoor, S.C. department.

"This grant is a landmark event for our fire district," said Terry. "The safety equipment that we will be able to purchase with this grant will provide our citizens with an ever higher level of fire protection, and allow us to ensure the safety of our volunteer firefighters at the fire scene. We are so proud that the grant selection group has chosen our fire district from so many deserving applicants."

Spratt said the grant was a prime of example of how the federal government helps small towns and communities. "It's a big help to the men and women who help protect communities like Edgemoor," Spratt said.

Spratt has been a strong supporter of funding for first responders. "Ten years ago," said Spratt, "Congress passed a bill that I authored along with former Senator Nunn of Georgia, calling attention to the emerging threat of terrorism at home and the spread of unconventional weapons. We pointed to the need for funding first responders in the awful case of a catastrophe. We passed our bill and allocated funds for first responders in our budget resolutions; but it took 9/11 to drive home the need and secure the funds."

"It's good to see the grants finally coming to our firefighters. We all hope the equipment these grants will buy will be used to improve routine fire protection and not be needed in a catastrophe. But the grants are a way for the federal government to say that first responders like firefighters play a more important role than ever."

The Assistance for Firefighters Grant Program is administered by the U.S. Fire Administration (USFA), part of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), and assists rural, urban and suburban fire departments throughout the United States. The funds are used by firefighters to increase the effectiveness of firefighting operations, firefighter health and safety programs, new fire apparatus, emergency medical service programs, and fire prevention and safety programs.
