### **Spratt Announces Humanities Council Grants**

WASHINGTON – Students in grades four and five in Rock Hill School District 3 will benefit from two grants from the Humanities Council, according to U.S. Rep. John Spratt (D-SC).

A \$4,000 grant, awarded to the Catawba Cultural Preservation Project, will allow fourth graders to experience Catawba Indian history, arts, and language. In addition to classroom study, the project includes a field study at the Catawba Indian Reservation.

A \$5,000 grant, awarded to District 3, will fund a field study for fifth graders to the restored 1929 Rosenwald school, an historic African American school used during the Depression. Students will learn about the impact of the Depression on the Rock Hill community, and have access to oral histories of former students of the school.
